

LIVE ONLINE COURSE

In this course, we shall explore the Fathers of the Church from the Council of Nicaea (AD 325) through the fourth and fifth centuries (with as guides St. Athanasius, St. Gregory of Nazianzus, St. Jerome, St. Augustine...) down to St. Gregory the Great in the sixth and seventh centuries and St. John of Damascus in the eighth. By engaging with these brilliant Christian minds, we will be able to explore more deeply the questions they dealt with: Who is Jesus Christ? How are we to interpret the Scriptures? What is the Christian life?

Dr. Pepino is professor of Greek, Latin, History, and Patristics at Our Lady of Guadalupe Seminary in Denton, Nebraska. His Master's degree is in Classical Greek and Latin and his Doctorate is in the Fathers of the Church. He has published on the Fathers of Church and on contemporary Church History (particularly Vatican II and the liturgy in the twentieth century).
